## Vern Griffey is still original owner of 1967 Plymouth

For some, 35 years can be a life time or just the blink of an eye. In April 1967 Lorraine and Vern Griffey ordered a Plymouth Belvedere II. That June they took possession of their new dark metallic blue 4dr with a white vinyl top.

As an employee of Hessel Motors in Gresham since 1958. Vern could buy one new car per year for \$100 over the dealer's cost. For the price of \$2,257 they got a car with a 318 C.I.D. engine, 727-torqueflite transmission, power steering, power brakes, air conditioning, cruise control, and an 8 3/4 rear end with a 2.73 ratio. All this and a 5-year, 50,000-mile warranty.

Vern stayed with Hessel Motors, the oldest Chrysler dealership west of the Mississippi, until 1980. During his career he worked as a mechanic, service manager, and as a parts

manager. Through the years Vern took classes through the Master Tech Program earning him the gold plated tools that are his pride and joy.

Now for the best part, the Griffeys still own and drive this car which is maintained in great condition. Vern kept the sales invoice and the original owner's manual. Vern tells us the spare tire has never been out of the trunk. The only concession to time was having the car recently repainted in the original color.

The meeting was concluded.


Bill and Dolores Call Award of Recognition from Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club

## National Plymouth Club Plymouth's B cars of the 60's, by Vern Griffey

In 1960 Chrysler Corporation went to a unibody frame design and designated the Belvedere and Fury as B bodies. The B body cars became the intermediate size cars for Plymouth and depending upon engine size, transmission and suspension could be either an economical family car or a factory stock racer.

Chrysler's B body autos were the primary representatives for the company in the so-called muscle car market and they performed

well on the track and strip.

In 1960 the Valiant had a 170 C.I.D. 6-cylinder standard engine, later in 1962 the 225 C.I.D. was available. From 1963 thru 1966 the 225 C.I.D. 6-cylinder and the 318 C.I.D. were the base engines. Also in 1963 the 383 C.I.D. with a 4-barrel or a 426 C.I.D. with twin 4barrel carbs became optional.

For the 1964 B cars the 360 C.I.D. was available. and a 426 C.I.D. Hemi with 2-4s was used in factory racers but carried no factory warranty.

The 440 C.I.D engine. became the big block of choice in 1967.

In the early 70s higher insurance rates along with fuel shortages and stricter emissions standards brought the muscle car era to an end.

#### Tom and Jennifer Brightbill's '64 Sport Fury, is definitely a crowd pleaser.

In the summer of 1994, Tom Brightbill of Oregon city located a complete, but extremely well used 1964 Plymouth Sport Fury in Vancouver [Wa.] Only a week before it had been used in the movie "Mr. Holland's Opus". Tom says "it was able to propel itself home, and that was about it".

It was originally light blue with a 318 engine and an automatic transmission.

The car was stripped down until all that was left in the body were two power window motors and the heater core.

The 318 was replaced with a 440 block, the static compression was lowered to 9.3:1 and electronic ignition installed. Disc brakes along with front and rear sway bars, and urethane bushings were added to help the ride. The rear end is now a '69 limited slip 3.54 [non-tapered axles]. A fourspeed transmission replaces the original automatic. All of this was to replicate the hottest factory set up offered by Plymouth in 64, known as the "Max Wedge" and still have a truly street able /drivable car.

All of the interior surfaces have been painted, plated and restored.

Almost all of the exterior chrome has been replated and the new paint color is red.

Since the summer of 1996 Tom and Jennifer have taken their red Fury to cruise-ins and have received their share of first place awards. Wherever they take their car it is definitely a crowd pleaser.


Their favorite photo shows the Fury with Tom and his son Ian who is in San Diego testing to become a Navy SEAL. The picture is autographed by racecar driver Richard Petty. When Richard signed it he commented, "that while it looked great, it was the wrong color". What he was referring to was Petty Blue, the color he made famous in 1964 when he won at Daytona with the first hemi powered Plymouth.

Now whenever Tom is unable to resist it any longer, "it will still set us back in the seats just like the good old days".



In March issue of the CPPC newsletter, we would like to feature Plymouths from the early 30's.



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


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## Do you know your nuts and bolts, etc.?

Did you ever wonder what those little lines on the head of a bolt were for? They're not for decoration, according to Lynn McCreery of Parkrose Hardware. Lynn was the guest speaker at the February 26<sup>th</sup> meeting.

According to Lynn, bolts come in three different grades. A bolt with no marking on the head indicates a Grade2 bolt, which is good for general Fastening. A bolt with 3 lines on the head indicates a Grade 5 strength bolt, which is good for general fastening and some torqued applications. A bolt head with 6 lines indicate a **Grade 8** bolt which can be used for applications requiring high strength and maximum torque values, such as cylinder head bolts. Charts are available with strengths and torque capabilities for each grade.

Parkrose Hardware is at 10625 N.E. Sandy Blvd they have 35,000 square ft. of extensive inventory of fasteners [bolt and nuts] along with plenty of other hardware items, such as pins, springs,

helicoils, rubber buttons, hose clamps, shim stock, washers, e-clips, roll pins, rivets, threaded stock and screws made of both steel and stainless steel. They also have a selection of metric in stainless steel.

Lynn says they can also thread bolts all the way to the head, while you wait if the need arises. You can buy together with others and buy things by the box to get a 30% to 45% savings.

They have a special order department, so they can help you find exactly what you need. They pride themselves on catering to "Car Restoration People".


