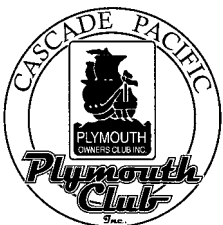

Nursing Home Community Service: Mike recently received a query about members taking their cars to lo-

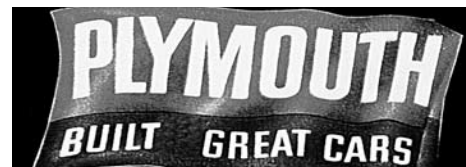
cal nursing homes on weekends. Barbara Rice volunteered to take this on for the club.

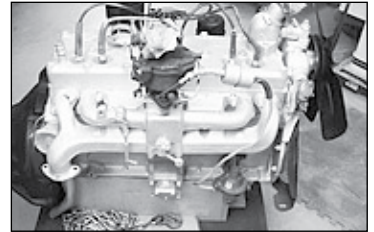

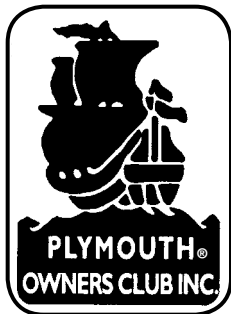
