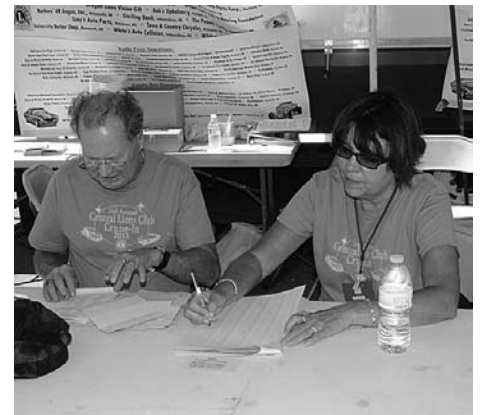
Process begins for nominating 2014 officers

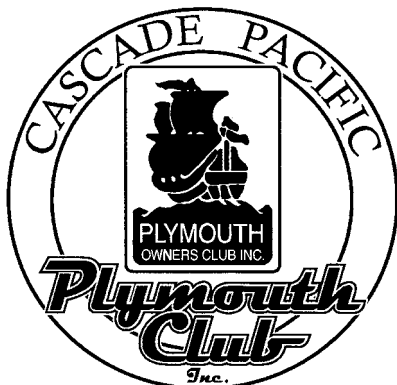

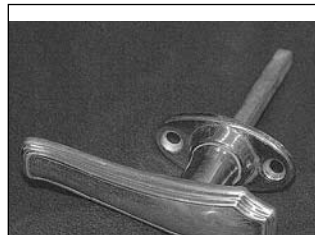

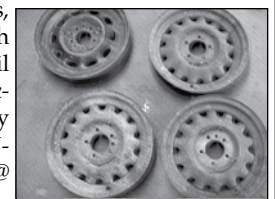
