So we'll be doing it again: setting up a CPPC booth at Portland Swap Meet in early April to sell donated parts and miscellaneous stuff, swap stories with the folks who stop by the booth, and perhaps attract new members to our club.

To make this work, we need three things:

We need donations. If you're cleaning out your garage or shop, if you have parts left over after completing a project, if you know of a neglected old Plymouth sitting in a garage somewhere – let the Tech Committee know, and we'll arrange to get it picked up.

We'll work out a **consignment** deal if you have things you want to sell at the club's booth.

We need labor in advance of the event. The Tech Committee will gather at Gary Rusher's place on April 1 to sort, clean and price the merchandise, and load the trailer that we take to the

event.

We need members to work 2-hour shifts in the booth. This is a chance to represent our club where in counts – in a gathering devoted to the car hobby. It's always a surprise to see how many people remember Plymouths from the past, had Plymouths of their own, or have one right now, are working on it, and need parts or advice.

It's a 1600 mile drive: plan ahead for POC National Meet in Lincoln, NE, June 14-16

The Prairie Region of the Plymouth Owners Club will host the 60th Anniversary National Meet of POC in Lincoln, NE. June 14-16, 2017.

Registration forms are already available on the national POC website, along with descriptions of daily activities planned for the event.

Registration is due by May 15.

Google maps says it's a mere 1,607 miles from Clackamas to Lincoln via I-84 and I-80, and driving time is estimated as 23 hours, 11 minutes.

Tours and activities are planned on Thursday and Friday, with the Car Show, judging and banquet on Saturday.

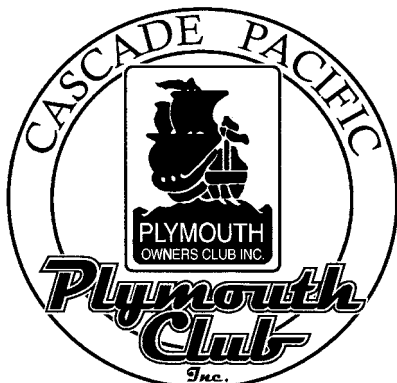

The meeting was adjourned about 8:30.

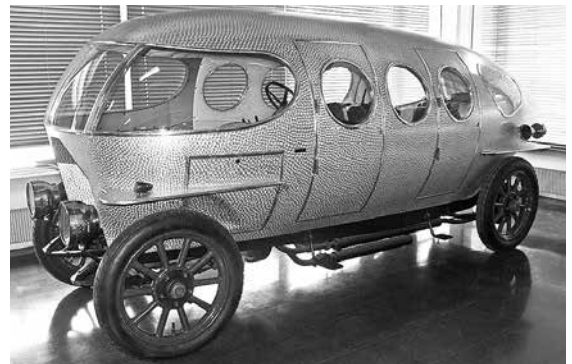

Lapins share locksmith recommendation

When Phil and Jean Lapin acquired their 1942 Plymouth from CPPC, there was one precious and worn set of keys for it. Phil spent some time going to your typical key cutting services - all of whom were unable to even find a proper blank for the keys.

Upon a friend's recommendation, Phil went to Gresham Locksmith (617 SE 223rd in Gresham).

They are a family owned business that has been around for a LONG time - and they have a huge inventory of different key blanks (many thousands of them). Alec ("Erik") was able to find one correct blank for Phil - which was used to cut a new ignition/door key. The same key blank will fit into the trunk lock, so they are now ordering 20 key blanks to keep in inventory.

These folks estimate that they work on about 100 antique vehicles each year. They can even make keys from scratch to fit a lock without an existing key.

If there is enough interest, they may even be able to order key blanks with a logo on them!

The combination of an excellent resource, combined with a love of antique vehicles is great! So now, the '42 Plymouth is on her way to two new sets of keys - and hard ones to find at that.

Minutes of the November 2016 board meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.
