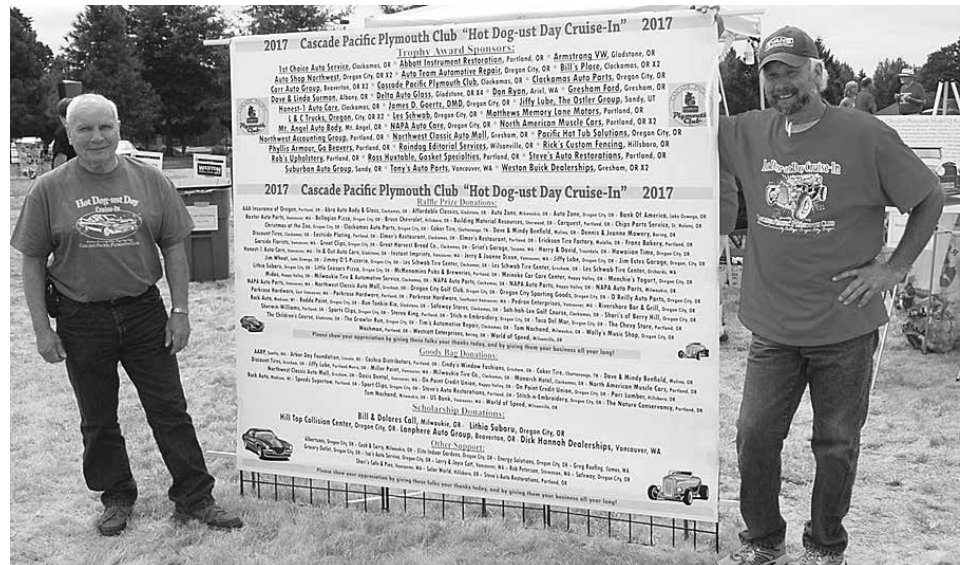
We had a good thing going, and we made it better, judging by the outcome of CPPC's 2017 Hot Dog-Ust Day Cruise-In & Car Show.

We limited the number of trophies for the same reason: at one sponsor per trophy, we wouldn't have enough time to award them all, so many trophies bore two sponsors' names.

We were concerned about weather. Last year's event fell on the hottest day of the year. This year we were prepared with extra shade and a more hospitable layout in general. The weather was fine, but the shade was appreciated and the field looked nicer than last year.

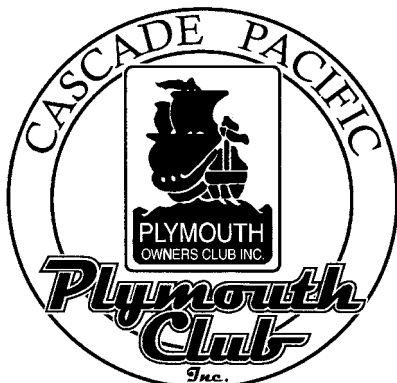

Mike Bade has agreed to run for the position of club president.

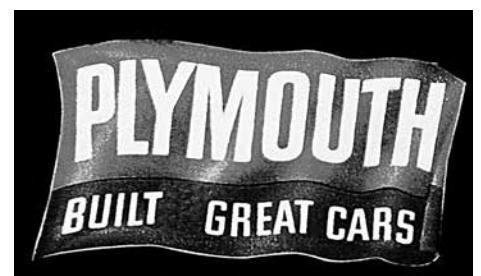
Rodney Vistica agrees to appear on the ballot for the position of vice-president.

Don and Jim both trophied 2nd in their classes, Street Rod Pre'50 and MoPAR Related, respectively. Jim

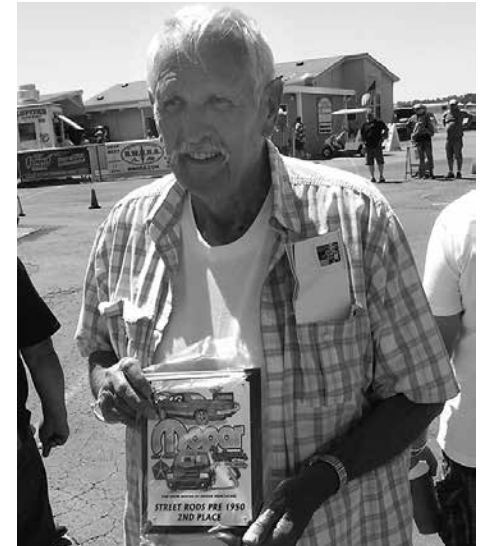
wound up in that rather odd class because his Dodge didn't fit in any other class. Stingray also won with a 1st place in the Trucks Vans & SUVs class.

New Business: The car show committee met at the Clackamas Community College site to review the layout and complete planning for the car show.

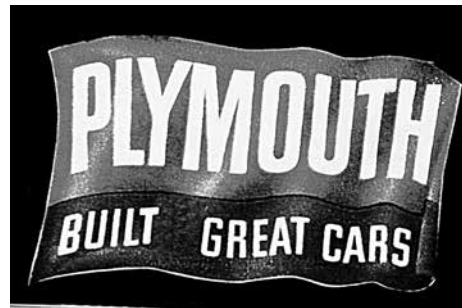

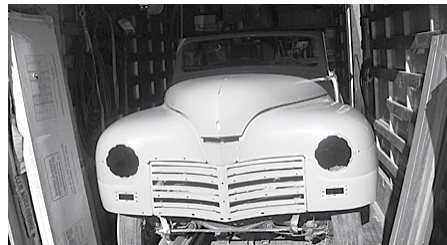
