After everything that could go wrong went wrong, we had a great day

Although the story is a sort of cliffhanger, it has a happy ending.

On Wednesday June 15 we learned we had to relocate the car show we had scheduled for Saturday the 18th spring rains had left Clackamette Park too wet to park cars on the grass.

Before the end of the day, Mike Bade had gotten us into the End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center, a venue that was smaller, but offered pavement and shelters.

Mike and Pam Ealy hustled to make certain everybody was notified - emailing those who were pre-registered, changing the club's website and social media.

Then everybody waited to see who would show up.

We ended up with 94 cars - 55 had pre-registered, and another 39 registered the day of the show. That was 120 cars less than our 2019 total in Clackamette Park, but it was a good showing on a rainy day.

The up-side was that these folks





spent about the same for raffle items as the larger 2019 crowd. The coffee and donut sales turned out about the same, and the 50/50 jackpot did better..

Award sponsors, raffle items, and donations direct to CPPC's scholarship fund exceeded what we did in 2019, even with the smaller turnout.

Attendees liked the event, and started emailing their thanks and praise the day of the show. (See page 4).

Longtime CPPC member Don Amundson passed June 5

We haven't seen Don in Oregon since the 2010 National Meet, but he was active in the National Hot Rod Association in the Puget Sound area, and was a frequent contributor of articles to our newsletter over the years.

We send our condolences to Lynda and the Amundson family.

Randy Ealy summed it up.

"This year we received \$3650.00 in sponsor donations. We gave \$1000.00 to the CCC track team and \$2650.00 to CCC auto department for scholarships. In January we sent \$1500.00 to the college early so they could hand out the scholarships and not have to miss a year. Now we can send a check for the balance \$1150. This leaves \$2000.00 from the car show proceeds for the club treasury."



Minutes of May's membership meeting

Members of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on May 24, 2022, at the Clackamas Community Club, 15711 SE 90th Ave., Clackamas, OR 97015.

Twenty-three members attended the meeting and four more participated via Zoom. Robin Will took the minutes.

President Jim Wheat called the meeting to order at 7:00PM and led the group in the flag salute.

Jim thanked Dave and Linda Surmon for bringing refreshments.

The ordinary agenda was abandoned so accommodate Arnold Landvoigt as guest speaker via Zoom from Savage, Maryland, several time zones away. His presentation dealt with a 92-year-old cold murder case that involved a Federal Prohibition agent and a 1929 Pontiac. It is the only case of a murdered Federal agent whose body has never been recovered.

Following Arnold's presentation, minutes of the April 26, 2022, meeting were approved as published in the May newsletter. Later in the meeting, this resolution was amended: the Lions Club will be cooking a hamburger lunch at our June 18 cruise-in, not, as reported in the minutes, a pancake breakfast.

The financial report indicates the club is in good condition, primarily due to eBay sales of donated parts, which have reached a total of \$11,500 over the past year.

Mike Bade reported on the donation of the Larry Kangas/Bill Call mural to Dale Matthews at Memory Lane Motors. Jim Wheat, Mike Bade, Steve Heaton, Gary Rusher and Robin Will took advantage of a sunny morning to remove the rolled-up mural from the club trailer and spread it out in Rushers' driveway to assess its condition. Twelve years of storage hadn't caused any damage, so they re-rolled the mural, loaded it in Gary's truck and took it to Memory Lane Motors. The mural will be displayed on a wall at the dealership; Mike Bade will create an explanatory plaque for the display, and he hopes it will be possible to turn the unveiling at the dealership into a club

event.

Mike Bade reported on the May 3 tour of The Brothers car collection in Salem, which attracted 125 people from several car clubs.

The next scheduled activity is a tour of the Eagle Creek Lavender Farm on June 23. A sign-up sheet was passed.

Tee-shirts and polo shirts for CPPC's June 18 Cruise-In Down By the Riverside were available at the meeting for those who had reserved them online. Mike Bade said he had technical problems and had substituted a different image for the polo shirts, and offered to print the large cruise-in image from the tee-shirts on the back of the polo shirt for any member who wanted the car show image. Later in the meeting, it was clarified that future polos would NOT be printed on the back; that Mike's offer was for members only and would be limited to shirts already sold.

Randy Ealy summarized planning for the June 18 Down By the Riverside Cruise-In. We already have sponsors for all 30 awards, and trophies have been ordered. There were more sponsors than awards, and some sponsors donated more than the \$50 specified, so there is currently a cash surplus of about \$2000 that will go towards scholarships. Randy said CPPC volunteers will gather in the park at 6:30AM on June 18 to set up tents and tables, and to mark the sprinklers in the park. Gates will open at 7:00AM, participants will park their cars with the help of college student runners, and then pay at the registration desk.

Member Care: Dennis Mowery is preparing for a hip replacement soon. Gary Rusher is doing well after a brief hospitalization. Randy and Pam Ealy are recovering from COVID.

Robin Will reported on the newsletter and website, thanking the four people who had contributed articles or photos to the newsletter. Seven hundred eight-seven people had visited the website as of May 24, and Scott Whiteman's technical articles continue to be a major draw to the site.

Jim Wheat shared some gas-tax triv-

Kara Marie Chytka July 3, 1978-May 21, 2022

Kara Marie Chytka passed away peacefully on May 21, 2022 in her home in Aumsville, Oregon surrounded by her husband, children and family at age 43 after a 21-year battle with ALS and Lyme Disease.

She is survived by her husband Chris Chytka, children Brianna Chytka (Kevin Thompson), Taylor Chytka and Olivia Chytka (Ronnie Slone) and grandson, Declan Thompson.

In 2001, Kara became ill and was initially diagnosed with ALS; doctors told her she would only live two to three years. Even with the alternative diagnosis of Lyme disease, her prognosis was not good.

Kara lived long enough to be an active parent to her children, and to see her grandson, Declan.

Over the 21 year course of her illness, she advocated publicly for Lyme disease patients, appeared as the subject of news stories and worked towards legislative change at the state level.

Kara's Celebration of life will be held October 8th 2022, at Union Hill Grange Sublimity Oregon. Time to be determined.

The Board of Directors of Cascade Pacific Plymouth Club met on Tuesday, June 4, 2022, at 11:30AM at Elmer's Restaurant in Clackamas, Oregon.

Present were Jake Higginbotham, Mike Bade, Jerry amd Joanne Dixon, Randy Ealy, Dolores Call, and Robin Will. Robin Will took the minutes.

Mike Bade called the meeting to order at 12:00 noon.

Minutes of the May 10, 2022 Board meeting were approved as printed in the May newsletter.

Dolores Call's financial report was approved as submitted. We don't publish our bank balance, but the club remains in good financial condition and any board member can provide information.

Mike Bade reported another \$400 in income from internet sales, which have slowed down recently.

Guest speaker at the June 28 meeting will be Dale Moreau, a photographer who specializes in automobiles (story on page 1).

Member Care: Gary Rusher is at home in his 10-day recovery period from COVID and is doing well. Members are reminded to call Pam Ealy with any member care updates.

Cruise-In business: Joanne Dixon reported that we had 30 trophy sponsors, 80 raffle items, 50 items for goodie bags, 12 high-ticket items for the silent auction, 15 donations of cash that will go directly to the scholarship fund, and seven individuals who have offered

other forms of support.

Mike Bade displayed pictures of a couple of banners he made for the vent, as well as the thank-you cards that will go out to donors.

Randy Ealy announced that he had found a DJ (with equipment) for the event whose fee would be \$500, and he would need a tent or canopy for his sound system.

Randy said 60 people were pre-registered, and that 300 dash plaques had been printed.

Randy has a protocol for unloading the trailer, so things come out in the sequence that they're needed, and a protocol for set-up that will keep us out of our own way at the event.

Randy says he has enough sign-ups to complete all of the jobs at the event, and we have enough judges committed to get through the process.

At around 1:30, he'll recruit members to start shifting the crowd towards the tends for the 2:00 awards program. We'll begin with the awarding of checks for the scholarship funds. This year Pam will keep track of winners, so we know who won the awards

A debrief meeting will be scheduled after the event so we can note what did and didn't work.

In other business, Randy raised the possibility of quarterly meetings at convenient times, in place of our current sparsely-attended monthly meetings. We'll be raising that subject at the next membership meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 1:30PM.


